TargetSafety and VCOS Announce a \$1.5 Million Online Training Grant for U.S. Volunteer and Combination Fire Departments

DENVER – August 15, 2008 – TargetSafety, the U.S. leader in online enterprise risk management solutions for public entities, and the Volunteer & Combination Officers Section (VCOS), a section of the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC), today announced the availability of a \$1.5 million training grant for volunteer and combination fire departments in the U.S.

The grant will provide these departments with six months of free access to TargetSafety's PreventionLink™ platform. TargetSafety and VCOS will review all applications and notify grant winners by December 31. The program runs through June 30, 2009
